

### TALBOT COUNTY, MARYLAND

County Council MINUTES June 8, 2021

Present – President Chuck F. Callahan, Vice President Pete Lesher, Frank Divilio, Laura Price, County Manager Clay Stamp, and Acting County Attorney Patrick Thomas. Council member Corey W. Pack was absent.

I.  $\underline{\text{Agenda}}$  – The Agenda of Tuesday, June 8, 2021 was brought forward for approval. Mr. Lesher made a motion to amend the Agenda to include a request from the De Shields family for a letter in support of their grant application for the Bellevue Passage Museum; the motion was seconded by Mr. Divilio. Council approved the Agenda, as amended, by voting 4-0 as follows:

- II. <u>Minutes</u> Mr. Callahan requested and received unanimous consent for approval of the Minutes of Tuesday, May 18, 2021.
- III. <u>Disbursements</u> Mr. Callahan requested and received unanimous consent for approval of the Disbursements of Tuesday, June 8, 2021.
- IV. Introduction of Joye Nagle, Talbot County Finance Director Council introduced Joye Nagle, the new County Finance Director. Ms. Nagle stated that she has a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting, an MBA, and is a Certified Public Accountant. She stated that her work experience includes working for large public companies, the nonprofit and government sectors in both the financial and business management areas. Ms. Nagle stated that she is a resident of Talbot County and looks forward to working with her County colleagues. Council members and County Manager, Clay Stamp, welcomed Ms. Nagle to Talbot County.
- V. <u>Introduction of David Edwards, Talbot County Director of Human Resources</u> Council introduced David Edwards, the new County Director of Human Resources. Mr. Edwards stated that he recently relocated to the area from Long Island, New York where he served as Global Vice President of People for a large manufacturing company; his previous experience includes working for General Electric, Samsung and LG Electronics. Council members and County Manager, Clay Stamp, welcomed Mr. Edwards to Talbot County.
- VI. Presentation of Certificate of Recognition to Vernon Cephas, Talbot County Department of Corrections

  Employee of the Year for 2020 Council recognized Mr. Vernon Cephas as the Department of Corrections

  (DOC) Employee of the Year for 2020. Mr. Cephas stated that he is a native of Easton and has worked for the Talbot County DOC for approximately four and one-half years as a corporal with the transportation unit. Terry Kokolis, Director, Talbot County Department of Corrections, stated that Corporal Cephas is responsible for transporting and picking up inmates in the 23 counties of the state, and as such, represents everyone in the county. Mr. Kokolis spoke of the many attributes Corporal Cephas brings to the Department, including his even temperament and empathetic nature. Council members congratulated Corporal Cephas on having received the award from his peers. The Clerk read a certificate of recognition from the Council and a statement from Director Kokolis into the record. The statements recognized Corporal Cephas' commitment to

VII. Presentation of FY 2022 Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation (MALPF) Easement
Applications – Martin Sokolich, Planner III – Mr. Sokolich requested Council's approval to submit the 12 topranked easement applications to the State for the MALPF FY 2022 easement purchase consideration; 35
applications were received. He outlined the criteria by which the applications presented are ranked and stated
that all are in the County's Priority Preservation Area; all top-ranked applications were reviewed and approved
by the Talbot County Land Preservation Advisory Board and the Planning Commission. He stated that the
purpose of the easement application is to permanently retire the development rights on the subject properties.

Prior to the public hearing, Ray Clarke, County Engineer, stated that the Public Works Advisory Board at its meeting on Wednesday, May 5, 2021, voted 5 – 0 to recommend to the Council that Resolution No. 299 not be approved. He stated that the Planning Commission had found that Resolution No. 299 was not consistent with the County's Comprehensive Plan. Miguel Salinas, Planning Officer, outlined the reasons for the Planning Commission's finding of inconsistency. Council discussion ensued with Mr. Salinas. Members of the public were afforded an opportunity to comment on the legislation. Written comments on Resolution No. 299 will be accepted until the close of business on Friday, June 11, 2021. Resolution No. 299 is eligible for vote on Tuesday, June 22, 2021.

Resolution No. 300. TRAPPE. MARYLAND 21673 AND SHOWN ON TALBOT COUNTY TAX MAP NO. 62 AS PARCELS 1 THROUGH 19 FROM UNPROGRAMMED TO "S-2" FUTURE PLANNED SEWER SERVICE IN 3 TO 5 YEARS (Ferry Point) was read into the record by the Clerk and brought forward for public hearing. Prior to the public hearing, Ray Clarke, County Engineer, stated that the Public Works Advisory Board, at its meeting on Wednesday, May 5, 2021 adopted a motion to recommend that the Council adopt Resolution No. 300, with an amendment to remove the S-2 classification for the residential properties. Miguel Salinas, Planning Officer stated that the Planning Commission, at its meeting on May 5, 2021, voted 5-0 that Resolution No. 300 was consistent with the County's Comprehensive Plan. Council discussion ensued with Mr. Clarke and Mr. Salinas. Members of the public were afforded an opportunity to comment on the legislation. Written comments on Resolution No. 300 will be accepted until the close of business on Friday, June 11, 2021. Resolution No. 300 is eligible for vote on Tuesday, June 22, 2021.

Resolution No. 301, A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE TALBOT COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE WATER AND SEWER PLAN TO APPROVE A CAPITAL PROJECT FOR THE IMPROVEMENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEM ON RUSTLING OAKS DRIVE, WYE MILLS, MARYLAND SHOWN ON TALBOT COUNTY TAX MAP 1, GRID 23 AS PARCEL 98 (Preserve at Wye Mills) was read into the record and brought forward for public hearing. Ray Clarke, County Engineer, stated that the Public Works Advisory Board, at its meeting on Wednesday, May 5, 2021, recommended that the Council table Resolution No. 301 until such a time as the Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) has been completed. At Council's previous request, Mr. Clarke has been working with the Office of Law on a Memorandum of Understanding between the County and The Preserve at Wye Mills Homeowners Association regarding repayment of funding provided by the County for the PER. Mr. Clarke stated that the PER is required before the County can submit an application for State funding for the project. Miguel Salinas, Planning Officer state that the Planning Commission, at its meeting on Wednesday, May 5, 2021, voted 5-0 that Resolution No. 301 is consistent with the County's Comprehensive Plan. Council discussion ensued with Mr. Clarke. Members of the public were afforded an opportunity to comment on the legislation. Written comments on Resolution No. 301 will be accepted until the close of business on Friday, June 11, 2021. Resolution No. 301 is eligible for vote on Tuesday, June 22, 2021.

Resolution No. 302, A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE EXECUTION OF A LEASE OF UNIMPROVED LAND AT THE EASTON AIRPORT DESCRIBED AS LOT 9200, CONSISTING OF THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED (35,200) SQUARE FEET, MORE OR LESS, FOR A TERM OF THIRTY (30) YEARS WITH THE RIGHT TO RENEW FOR UP TO TWO (2) ADDITIONAL TERMS OF FIVE (5) YEARS EACH, WITH RENT OF THIRTY-TWO THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED EIGHTY-FOUR DOLLARS AND FOUR CENTS (\$32,384.04) PER YEAR, SUBJECT TO ANNUAL ESCALATION IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE PERCENTAGE INCREASE IN THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX UP TO FIVE PERCENT (5%), AND WITH A REQUIREMENT THAT THE TENANT, AEROVANTI HANGAR, LLC, CONSTRUCT AN AIRCRAFT HANGAR AND RELATED IMPROVEMENTS; AND TO APPROVE EXECUTION OF A TWO-YEAR OPTION TO LEASE UNIMPROVED LAND AT THE EASTON AIRPORT DESCRIBED AS LOT 9180 AND LOCATED ADJACENT TO LOT 9200, WHICH LOT 9180 CONSISTS OF THIRTY SIX THOUSAND EIGHTY

FEET (36,080) SQUARE FEET, MORE OR LESS, FOR A TERM OF THIRTY (30) YEARS WITH THE RIGHT TO RENEW FOR UP TO TWO (2) ADDITIONAL TERMS OF FIVE (5) YEARS EACH, WITH A NONREFUNDABLE OPTION PAYMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF TWENTY-FOUR THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$24,000), PAYABLE IN MONTHLY INSTALLMENTS OF ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000) PER MONTH DURING THE OPTION TERM; AND, TO APPROVE, IN THE EVENT THE OPTION IS EXERCISED, THE TERMS OF SAID LEASE, WITH RENT IN THE AMOUNT OF THIRTY-THREE THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED NINETY-THREE DOLLARS AND FIFTY-SIX CENTS (\$33,193.56) PER YEAR, SUBJECT TO ANNUAL ESCALATION IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE PERCENTAGE INCREASE IN THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX UP TO FIVE PERCENT (5%), AND WITH A REQUIREMENT THAT THE TENANT, AEROVANTI HANGAR, LLC, CONSTRUCT AN AIRCRAFT HANGAR AND RELATED IMPROVEMENTS, was read into the record by the Clerk and brought forward for public hearing. Prior to the public hearing, Micah Risher, Manager, Easton Airport, introduced Steve Harr, representative of Aerovanti, the company requesting to lease land from Easton Airport. Mr. Harr briefed the Council on Aerovanti's plans for their operations at Easton Airport. Members of the public were afforded an opportunity to comment on the legislation. Upon motion by Ms. Price, seconded by Mr. Divilio, the Council approved Resolution No. 302 by voting 4 – 0 as follows:

XI. <u>Discussion of Proposed Assistance to Taxpayers Impacted by COVID-19</u> – Angela Lane, Talbot County Finance Director – Ms. Lane stated that the Council had approved her previous requests in April 2020 and December for approval of a waiver of interest and penalties on sewer bills through June 2021. She stated that approximately 4.3% of County sewer accounts have a balance of more than one (1) quarter and that it is her recommendation that the County continue to waive interest and penalties on sewer bills through December 2021. Ms. Lane stated that she had discussed the matter with County Engineer, Ray Clarke, and that he concurs with her recommendation. Council discussion ensued with Ms. Lane. Upon motion by Ms. Price, seconded by Mr. Lesher, the Council approved Ms. Lane's recommendation by voting 4 – 0 as follows:

Upon motion by Mr. Divilio, seconded by Ms. Price, the Council approved the appointment by voting 4 – 0 as follows:

E. Request for Letter of Support for Building African American Minds, Inc.'s (BAAM's) Grant Application to the Maryland Historical Trust African American Heritage Preservation Program – Requested Council approval to forward a letter in support of BAAM's grant application to the Maryland Historical Trust African American Heritage Preservation Program in the sum of \$100,000; if approved, the grant funding will be used toward the cost of construction of an Academic Center for the BAAM program in Easton which will enable the organization to expand its programming to also serve African-American female students in grades 1 through 5. Upon motion by Mr. Divilio, seconded by Ms. Price, the Council approved forwarding the letter of support by voting 4 – 0 as follows:

XIII. <u>Public Comments</u>: Members of the public were afforded an opportunity to comment on matters of interest to them.

#### XIV. Council Comments:

Mr. Lesher stated that he was delighted to be back in the Bradley Room in person with his Mr. Lesher colleagues, staff and most importantly, members of the public. He expressed his appreciation to all those who had been vaccinated to make it possible to meet in person and offered words of encouragement to any individuals who have not had the opportunity to become vaccinated. Mr. Lesher thanked all those who came out to speak to the Council on a variety of matters, and stated that, in his opinion, public engagement is vital to the health of the our democracy. He expressed his congratulations to all graduating seniors of Easton High School, their families, teachers and staff. He stated that he, Mr. Callahan and Mr. Pack had attended the ceremony and that Mr. Pack was representing the Council at the St. Michaels High School graduation tonight. He stated that this year's graduation class faced much adversity and that, in his opinion, no one was spared the impact of the pandemic. He stated that there were 270 students who graduated; only two students who did not graduate and they will be helped in order to meet the State and District graduation requirements. He stated that students are not dropping out as they did when he was in high school and, in his opinion, it is an extraordinary achievement for the school to make sure that no one gets left behind. Mr. Lesher concluded his comments by stating that, in his opinion, it is very important and a positive sign for society that we all count.

Ms. Price - Ms. Price stated that, in her opinion, all the Council members are very, very grateful to be back in the Bradley Room after almost a year and that she was thrilled to see so many faces. She stated that bringing us back together, seeing each other on the street, smiling at each other and starting to give hugs again, will, in her opinion, make all the difference in the world. She stated that, in her opinion, people are very divided and it did not help that in 2020 we could not be together and have real conversations – and she appreciates that tonight – to have staff here, the new faces and the faces of those who are leaving. Ms. Price congratulated the graduating seniors. She expressed condolences to the family of cartoonist and editorialist Rick Kollinger, stating that although he took jabs at a lot of political issues and even occasionally at the Council, she will miss him and his sense of humor.

Mr. Divilio - Mr. Divilio stated that his most recent Council comments were regarding what he had learned about sewer. He stated that for those who aren't aware of it, there are lots of sewer systems throughout the county that are failing. He stated that this time he learned about the Internet and that he does not like to see a company get bashed online for something that is

Easton Utilities and the excellent Internet they provide, but he has had to switch to a cell phone tower and thought he was the problem, not the technology, until learning that a protected species of bird had made a nest on the tower and the company is not able to put out a cell phone signal which affects a lot of people in Cordova, Trappe, and Wye Mills when they use the Internet. He stated that it has been a thorn in his side for a good while that cell phone calls cannot be made in the school or in the fire department in Cordova so he is going to continue to bring it to attention because, in his opinion, it is a significant safety issue which he thinks the Council can address. He stated that the small cell phone companies that are trying to put the Internet out are just a short fix; the County is working to bring broadband to communities; in the meantime, he asks that citizens be more civil online when they have a problem with their Internet, and not feel personally attacked and say that the company shut down their Internet – perhaps it is only a bald eagle making a nest.

- Mr. Callahan Mr. Callahan stated that the Council is working hard to help the community and reminded everyone that the Council is working on getting broadband, repairing schools, and hiring staff. He stated that Council members are not always going to agree but we can work together on a solution. Mr. Callahan expressed his appreciation to County staff and Acting County Attorney, Patrick Thomas, for all their hard work, and to the Sheriff Deputies for keeping the community safe.
- XV.
